

Human Remains at The Manchester Museum

This report should be read in conjunction with the Museum's Policy on Human Remains (available online at www.manchester.ac.uk/museum) which was developed following an extensive consultation period.

Definition of Human Remains used within this report.

The Manchester Museum acknowledges the definition of human remains given in the DCMS guidelines and bases its definition on that. The Museum uses the term human remains to mean the bodies, and parts of bodies of once living people from the species *Homo sapiens* (defined as individuals who fall within the range of anatomical forms known today and in the recent past). This includes osteological material (whole or part skeletons, individual bones or fragments of bone and teeth), soft tissue including organs and skin, blood, hair, embryos and slide preparations of human tissue. Human remains also include any of the above which have been modified in some way by human skill and/or may be physically bound-up with other non-human materials to form an artefact composed of several materials. Human remains include the bodies of people who lived thousands of years ago, and of those who have died within recent or living memory and include fossilised and sub-fossil hominins.

The data in this report is listed according to collection area within the Museum and within that by Accession Number. All data is correct at the date on the report, any changes to the data will be reflected in later editions of the report. From top to bottom, it depicts: two falcons facing a djed-pillar (symbol of Osiris), above a banner inscribed in Greek with the name of the deceased; Osiris flanked by two offering stands; a goddess (Nut or Isis) with outspread wings, flanked by two snakes; a jackal (Anubis); and the feet of the deceased.

Research on the mummy indicates that Asru died around age 60 and suffered from arthritis and a parasitic bladder infection (bilharzia or schistosomiasis).
